Christ The King Broadcasts Mass

Christ the King Church, Lexington, will go on the air each Sunday in August, Rev. Richard O'Neill, pastor, has announced.

Starting this Sunday, Aug. 5th, the eleven o'clock High Mass will be broadcast over radio station

WKLX of Lexington. The Mass will be celebrated by Father James F. Herlihy, assistant pastor of Christ the King. Father O'Neill will give the sermon and an accompanying commentary on the rites of the Holy Sacrifice.

Christ the King's new parochial school will be ready for pupils in September, Father O'Neill also disclosed. Finishing touches to the new building are now being completed. The Sisters of Divine Pro-

vidence of Melbourne, Ky., are teaching at Christ the King. Last year, classes were held at St. Catherine's academy pending the completion of the school building.
